


A STEP BY STEP GUIDE

Whilst you can apply for your provisional from the age of 15 years and 9 months, you can't start learning to drive a car until your 17 in most cases.





FIND A DRIVING INSTRUCTOR

Ask friends about their experiences, and choose an instructor you think you will really get along with. Don't choose an instructor you're not sure about just because they charge a couple of quid less per hour.

THE THEORY TEST

Did you know over half the people that take the Theory Test fail? But don't worry practice makes perfect. Brush up on the highway code and take as many mock tests as possible.






DRIVING LESSONS

You're paying for an expert to teach you, so it makes sense to get the most bang for your buck. So before a lesson make sure you're well rested & fueled. Sounds easy but listen and make sure you ask questions on anything you're not sure about.

THE PRACTICAL TEST

Before you start driving, you'll be asked to complete an eyesight test and some 'Show me Tell me' questions. Then you'll have 40 minutes to show the examiner the skills you have developed.
